Atlanta, Georgia, April 4, 1966 --- Rep-Elect Julian Bond, re-elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in February, has been challenged again.

In a hearing today at the state capitol the House set May 23 to hear charges that Bond should be denied his seat a second time. Bond and his attorney, Howard Moore, Jr., have until May 13 to file a response. They may subpoend witnesses for the Hearing on the 23rd.

The young Negro representative tallied an 82% victory in the 136th District when he ran in September. Bond was denied his seat in the House in January because he supported as tatement of opposition to United States involvement in the War in Vietnam issued by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committees

Bond ran unopposed in a Special Election in Februay, to fill the vacancy created by his ouster from the House.
