Rabbi Bleich of the Rabbinical Assembly , Committe for Racial Justice, went down to Hattiesburg for his organization. He will probably remain in Hattiesburg until Saturday.

Trials of Milton Hancock and Montague Fortner were scheduled for today-- since Garsie Hall was supposed to defend them and was unable to get to Hattiesburg by the scheduled time, the trials may have been postponed again for want of counsel.
