Five of those indicted are over thirty-five years of age. In suspending all the sentences on Oct. 23, one of the reasons given by Judge Watkins was that, "You are mostly young men just starting out."

The 11th arrest was made Oct. 5. In an Oct. 7 U.P.I. release it was stated that "several additional arrests may be made soon." It also said that reliable sources close to the investigation said as many as ten to fifteen more persons may be apprehended.

At the end of October no further arrests had been made in this connection. Thirteen of the sixteen bombings and all of the ten burnings remain unsolved.

The Indictments

P. Wilson, B. Wilson, H. Dunaway and G. Lawrence charged with illegal use of explosives at the Charles Bryant home July 26.

P. Wilson, B. Wilson charged with the illegal use of explosives at the home of Rev. James Baker, Sept. 9.

P. Wilson, J. Wilson, M. Duncan charged with attempted arson at Sweethome Church, July 18.

P. Wilson, B. Wilson, J. Wilson, M. Duncan, J. Westbrook, E. Lee and S. Gillis charged with conspiracy to bomb Alyene Quin house on Sept. 20.

P. Wilson, B. Wilson, and E. Zeek charged with bombing of Alyene Quin home.

Sterling Gillis was arrested a second time and the FBI filed federal bank robbery charges against him in connection with the \$40,000 robbery of the Lawrence County bank at Monticello March 2.

Charles Komack, one of those arrested, was not indicated.

The Sentences

P. Wilson and B. Wilson received three five year suspended sentences.

J. Wilson, G. Lawrence, H. Dunaway and E. Zeek each received a five year suspended sentence.

J. Westbrook, M. Duncan, E. Lee, and S. Gillis, by agreement, each received suspended sentences of six months and \$500. fines on pleas of nolo contendere. The others pleaded guilty.
