

Saturday April 20, 1963, I went to Ruleville, Mississippi to canvass with the School Students , who plan to help work this summer and after school. We canvassed the whole town of Ruleville, Mississippi. As I went by Mr. Willie Martin house strated to kill me so I maintain my coolness, I went on canvassing. And we finished Ruleville and I also made out a affidavit out against his man because he tried too kill me. This man was a negro and he has been telling the negroes there not to go and register , and he had an influence on the people should I say the negro race. We when to Shaw, Mississippi and canvassed until 5 p.m.

Monday April 22, 1963 I went out canvassing in the community I contacted about 40 people and 23 of these people say or said that they were going down to register. The star had a meeting.

Monday night April 22, 1963. We had a mass meeting and Mr. Joe McDonald was the speaker for the night. Lawrence Guyot ,Mr. Jordon, and Rev. Tucker had a few words to say and after they finished talking, we showed a film and sang some songs of freedom. The name of the film was "How important it is to vote".

Tuesday Morning April 23, 1963 I went out with on some follow up sheet and ~~xxxxxx~~ contacted 4 people to go down and register. Then I went over to the registration application with these four people so ~~xxxxx~~ when they would go down there and would atleast know to be expecting on the test. When I return to the office we had a staff meeting, after the meeting I went back out canvassing by this time school was out and students was out canvassing and passing out leaflets. I return back to the office about 6:30 am these were people in the office be be carried over the application, so I carried two(2) people over the application and I return home for the night.

Then I attend a concert with the students they were singing and talking

Wednesday Morning , I went out canvassing and contacted 22 people and some of the people said that they would go down and attempted to registered and on the other streets I canvassed I contacted 13 people said that they would go down to register also. After dinner there then we had a staff meeting and after the meeting we had a telephone call from Ruleville saying that some of the staff member were in jail. Then I went along with some of the others to Ruleville, Mississippi, I was in Ruleville ,Mississippi we then went to Indianola, Mississippi to talk with the cheif of Police that is where they had transferred the staff members. Then I return back to Ruleville, Mississippi and called the Justice Dept. and SNCC office in Atlanta, Georgia.

While in Ruleville the Staff member was jailed because he asked to use the Public Library and this is National Library Week. After the member left the Library and went two blocks he was picked up by the police and jailed without any charges and carried to the County Seat in Indianola, there was a group of local citizens they came and sang Freedom Songs around the Courthouse. We talked to the Mayor he said they had moved him somewhere to Indianola. The Mayor was shock up.
