According to Mank Edwards the threat ran along the lines : " I'll take you to the woods and leave you there". That was enough for Edwards. He and his wife were too frightened to sleep at home that night (Monday). Edwards and his wafe both freedom registered about a month ago, but Wood probably didn't know this, and didn't mention the 2 P.D.P. when he fired Edwards. There was, too, a further complication : Edwards had only worked two days out of four. Abe Flemm (COPO attorney) was , in effect , clutching conty straws. Is felt that he could only have pursued the case if Wood had made some specific reference to the P.D.P.
