DAILY REPORT

I talked with Mr. Williams and he said Mr. Hodges would not say yes or no on coming to speak. He said Hodges had the fears and put him off by looking into a problem for him (Mr. Williams). Mr. Williams plans to ask him about coming to the meeting on Monday or Tuesday. I am not pushing because Mr. Williams knows the principles involved.

The Community Economic Project continues. We will have the whole Negro community finished. Next week we will do a more thorough re-run--if we ever get that damn mimeo machine.

We went to Jackson to use the thermofax and mimeo machines, get office supplies, talk to Jesse Morris about the Mileston Coop, and see Mr. Daniels about the A.S.C. elections and Mr. Smith about the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. The election information was most valuable. We do not have to vote for the complete slate of five. Instead the vote may be legally limited to one candidate. The work ahead is to nominate a man for each community and see that his name is circulated. Judy spent some time in Jackson going over the material on welfare.
