

Monday, Aug. 30: A miracle, in the form of someone with a car (Al Kamens, down to work on schools for a week) appeared. Canvassed all of Mt. Zion area for schools, got a fairly good response.

Tuesday, Aug. 31: Canvassed area around Sharpsburg. A fairly good response. Held a workshop on the Challenge at Mt. Zion, Kenner Christiansen, FDP volunteer left the project for the north today.

Wednesday, Sept. 1: Took families over to register at school. For an account of events occurring, see the Madison County School Desegregation report. We were concerned with Farmhaven Elementary School.

Thursday, Sept. 2: In the morning Al took kids over to school, I canvassed road south of St. Paul's for a precinct meeting. Only 5 people showed up for the workshop at Magdalene, so didn't hold it (in retrospect, I probably should have held it anyway). Got affidavits on tuition-law from some of the people there. Canvassed around Mt. Zion until the time for the St. Paul meeting, to which no one showed. This meeting had allegedly been arranged by Ed Andrew Green.

Friday, Sept. 3: Took Mrs Anderson and the Jobes over to Farmhaven to attempt to register, but the school was closed up. Collected various affidavits from around the Mt. Zion area, and from the Henry's (family with children in a desegregated school). That night went to a fund-raising precinct meeting at Pleasant Green.

Saturday, Sept. 4: Attempted to canvas in the morning around Camden, but the roads, due to rain, prevented that. In the afternoon went in to Canton for the movement meeting.

Sunday, Sept. 5: Stopped at Mr. Henry's. Found out Billy Noble (notorious law officer) had stopped at their house Friday night while the parents were away and made some implied bomb threats to the kids. Also, Mr. Henry got a notice of acceptance from the school board, but with no buses to be provided. Al dropped me off at Mt. Zion for church.
