Crawfordville Enterprises celebrates its first anniversary as a community corporation at this annual observance by Taliaferro County of the Emancipation Proclamation. Today Crawfordville Enterprises will cut the ribbon officially opening the third of its people-owned factories, the first building to go in its 60-acre industrial and residential development tract.

It has been said many times by many different individuals that Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation freed Negro people legally but that it did not free them economically. It is fitting that we can at this occasion celebrate the beginning of our economic freedom. Today our production program projects an annual payroll for nearly 100 persons of close to one half million dollars and is the largest in our county. We are on our way to meaningful determination of our personal, family and community prerogatives.




Brig Cabe 1943-2014










Two federal court cases resulted from the school protests. In Turner v. Goolsby, the court ruled that it was illegal to use public funds to bus white students to adjoining counties, while refusing to bus black students.

The U.S. Supreme Court case Turner v. Fouche argued October 20, 1966, and decided January 19, 1970, changed the method used for selecting jurors and, subsequently, school board members.


