SUBJECT: KKKP, ORANGE, FLA.¹

On November 18, 1958, Sheriff Tom King and Deputy Sheriff J. B. King of Orange County, were interviewed with reference to the recent activities in that locality. They advised they know of no active KKKP Chapter in Orange County. However, it was believed that some 2 to 3 groups are active in the KKKP and attend meetings elsewhere. These individuals are as follows:

1. Miss Myrtle² age about 30. This negro formerly ran a store but is presently out of business.
2. Joe Ann³ age 22 to 25, runs a bar and is a bartender.
3. John⁴ approximately 40 who works for the State Printing House.
4. Frank⁵ a "head of all trades", especially a mechanic.
5. A negro, name unknown, who works for the Jackson Printing Company, approximately 50 to 55 years of age, baldheaded and a neat dress.

King suggested that the writer contact L. G. King⁶ who is head of the Citizens Council in Orange County, Florida. He runs a collection agency at the present time. The writer called by Mr. King's office but he was out and at home.

NOTE: Contact L. G. King at Orange to determine the identity of negroes active in the KKKP in Orange County.
