YOUTH MARCH FOR INTEGRATED SCHOOLS  
WASHINGTON, D.C., OCTOBER 25, 1958

NOTE: This March is for:

1. Young people of high school and college age.
  2. Children from fourth grade to eighth grade if accompanied by a parent or an adult designated by a parent.
1. The cost per child, round trip, is \$5.50. This does not include supper, which is 50¢ extra. The cost of this meal will be collected on the bus.
  2. The cost per adult is \$8.00 round trip.
  3. All buses are to leave New York at 7:30 a.m., Saturday, October 25.
  4. To save time and trouble, each person should carry his own lunch. No lunch will be served in Washington. (The difference in arrival time and the need to assemble correctly and promptly make dispersal for lunch inadvisable.)
  5. Supper will be served in several churches at 5:00 p.m. Your bus will take you to the proper church.

  7. Buses leave Washington at 6:30 p.m.
  8. Buses will arrive at same point from which they started at 11:00 p.m., Saturday, October 25.
  9. Buses will be leaving from Manhattan, Bronx, Brooklyn and Queens. Individuals and small groups that buy their bus tickets from the Youth March Committee will be placed in the bus that leaves closest to their home and returned to the same point.
  10. Activities (March, etc.) begin at 2:30 p.m. at a point to be announced.

11. The Parade will assemble at a point to be announced. Those travelling by car, train or plane will assemble at the same point.
12. Parents should arrange to meet their children when bus returns. No young person under 18 should be sent to Washington unless a parent or responsible adult, assigned by the parent, is planning to meet the young person to see that he gets home safely.
13. Organized groups such as churches, unions, bands, clubs and community groups are responsible for the care and safety of the children they transport.
14. All grade school children who go on the trip must be accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult.
15. Some combination of five nurses, teachers, parents, ministers, and adult advisors will be in every bus and they will be included in the line of march to lend support and dignity to the occasion.
16. Young people should dress simply, wear walking shoes, and have adequately warm outer garments.
17. Adequate care has been arranged in Washington to meet any emergencies.
18. Activities in Washington:
  - (a) The March will begin at 2:30 p.m. at a point to be announced. The March will proceed along Constitution Avenue to the Lincoln Memorial or another termination point -- a distance of one and a half miles.
  - (b) At the conclusion of the March there will be a meeting at the Lincoln Memorial, or another place to be announced. Young people, Negro and white, from North and South, will participate. Mrs. Daisy Bates is attempting to arrange to be present and will conclude the affair with an inspirational talk to the young people.
  - (c) At 5:00 p.m., buses will take their passengers to designated churches for supper. Following supper the buses will leave for New York. All buses are expected to reach the same place they started from by 11:00 p.m., where parents are expected to meet or have someone meet all persons under 18 years of age.
19. If you are not going with a church, union or other organization you can purchase your tickets from the Committee. Money for tickets should be sent to 312 West 125th Street, by October 20. Tickets will then be mailed with enclosed final instructions indicating where to board bus. Make checks payable to: YOUTH MARCH FOR INTEGRATED SCHOOLS.
