- NOTES: This report is divided into three major parts. <u>PART ONE</u> deals with income and disbursements. <u>PART T.10</u> list churches that organized buses with our cooperation. <u>PART THREE</u> lists all contributions from individuals and organizations over twenty-five dollars. In reading parts two and three several factors should be kept in mind:
 - 1. Regarding church participation, one will note that contrary to the usual pattern, churches did not make substantial contributions to over-head. This fact springs from the staff having urged churches to invest their money and energy in sending bus-loads of young people to Washington.

Secondly, a number of other churches, beyond those listed, did organize buses and participate, but because they organized their own buses, they were not listed in the central office.

Churches out-side the New York area that did an excellent job of organizing buses in such cities as Philadelphia, Baltimore, etc. are not included in this list.

- 2. Regarding labor union support, it is good to know that about 50 unions were helpful in taking buses, providing materials and food and made substantial financial contributions. This report makes no attempt to list all the services unions so graciously contributed. However, special mention must be made of the New York Butchers District Council, of Mr. Joseph Cohen, of the Amalgamated Maat Cutters and of the Butchers Workman. 1,000 pounds of meat were collected from locals. This contribution coming from Local 400, Meat Cutters, Joint Board Fur Dressers and Dyers and others, made it possible for the committee to serve almost 6,000 people at 50¢ per meal. Without this important contribution we should have had either to raise the cost of each meal or raised considerably more funds to subsidize a reasonable one.
- 3. Many individuals, store keepers and organizations contributed directly to community groups which organized buses. Such contributions are not acknowledged here because these checks or cash contributions did not clear through the central office but rather went directly from the community group to the bus company.

- 4. As of October 31, 1958 we had collected for this project \$18,319.38. Of this amount \$16,981.42 was disbursed. This leaves \$1,337.96 on hand. There are a few small bills including telephone yet to be paid.
- 5. Special Assistances:-
 - Special thanks should be extended to Maida Springer whose untiring efforts made possible the raising of several thousands dollars from labor unions.
 - Special thanks should be given to Rev. C. Shelby Rooks, chairman of the Washington Committee. Without his help and the help of over twenty Washington churches we would not have been able to feed 6,000 young people and their parents.
 - 3. Special thanks should be given to Mr. Glascow who not only organized Harlem for sending over thirty buses but in addition he found time to collect funds for the overhead expenses of the committee.
 - 4. Special thanks should be given to Mr. Charles Buchanan for his success in raising funds from the Harlem businessmen.
