RECOMMENDATIONS

PASSED BY THE

STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE COMPERENCE

ATLANTA, GEORGIA

OCTOBER 14-16, 1960

COORDINATION

A. The General Conference accepts the following as the statement of purpose for the student movement.

"We affirm the philosophical or religious ideal of nonviolence as the foundation of our purpose, the presupposition of our faith, and the manner of our action. Nonviolence as it grows from Indnic-Christian traditions seeks a social order of justice permeated by love. Integration of human conicavor represents the crucial first step towards such a society.

"Through nonviolence, courage displaces fear; love transforms hate. Acceptance dissipates prejudice; hope ends despair. Peace dominates war; faith reconcile doubt. Mutual regard cancels enmity. Justice for all overthrows injustice. The redemptive community supercedes systemd of gross social immorality.

"Love is the central motif of nonviolence. Love is the force by which God binds man to himself and man to man. Such love goes to the extreme; it remains loving and forgiving even in the midst of hostility. It matches the capacity of evil to inflict suffering with an even more enduring capacity to absorb evil. all the while persisting in love.

"By appealing to conscience and standing on the moral nature of human existence, nonviolence nurtures the atmosphere in which reconciliation and justice become actual possibilities".

(This Statement of Purpose was adopted in Raleigh, North Carolina on April 17, 1960, at the close of the first general conference of student movement participants.)

B. The Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee be established as coordinator and administrative body of the student movement in South, with its directives and functions delegated to it by the General Conference. This Committee shall be composed of:

1. One Delegate from cach of the following states:

2. The General Conference will elect six members-at-large at least three of whom should have served on the Committee

D. All members of the committee shall have equal status and shall

- E. Local protest groups shall remain autonomous.
- For rurposes of coordinating and communication, local sauge should, if possible, organize a State group to coordinate State Activities and to maintain contact with the Stufent Nonviolent Coordinating Committee.
- The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee shall remain self-directing but shall welcome cooperation with adult organizations which are supporting the movement.
 - 11. Among the functions of the Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee are:
 - 1. To maintain contact with students outside the South. To cooperate with these groups in nation-wide activities
 - that are in keeping with the above statement of purpose.
 - To try to encourage their involvement in problems of discrimination in their own areas.

The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee shall have five

 - A. The conference authorize publication of a newsletter by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee stafff in Atlanta, th

- B. One purpose of the newsletter is to print studing interesting to students involved in the student appropriate.
- C. The newsletter is sent to protest areas in the South, the North, to school newspapers and to interested resorts.
- D. Any press releases that are not concerning policy be left to the discretion of the staff of the Student Association Coordinating Committee as to wording and need.
- E. The Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee shall release statements concerning policy.
- F. The Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee publish a descriptive pamphhet to be used for promotion, information, and fund-raising.
- G. Each protest area appoint one reporter who will write to the office of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee at least once per month, reporting the status of the movement in his area. The reporters will also send school newspapers and other news clippings so that the office of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee may be kept abreast of the "inside Story" and may release such via the newsletter.
- H. The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee consider establishing a subscription rate for the newsletter and set up the structure necessary to handle such.

III. Finance

.

Since the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee has accepted to set up coordination and communication on a South-wide basis it was and still is necessary that the representatives from the Status meet regularly. In some instances representatives cannot secure movey from their respective areas; consequently, it is necessary for the "thent Nonviolent Coordinating Committee to provide travel funds, room and board.

The maintenance of the office of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee requires money - for supplies, mailings, and staff. To date, all persons working in the office have done so for a minimal sum; hereafter, such persons will be salaried.

It is necessary for students to meet periodically in a General Conference. This requires funds.

In view of the above and, considering the advancements and extrasions that will need to be made:

- A. The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee be authorized to raise funds, freeing them from dependence upon individual contributions.
- B. The Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee appoint a Finance

 F. The office of the Student Monviolent Coordinating Committee shall apply for non-profit status and retain its account at the Citizens Trust Company of Atlanta, Georgia.
- G. All funds coming into the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee be handled by the Chairman of the Finance Committee together with his committee and the advisors of the Student nonviolent Coordinating Committee.
