Interview with Dorothy Conrod, 898 North Division 907 E. Reden st.

Mrs. Conrod was visiting on North Division st. on Monday evening and after hearing the shots she went out in the street and down to the Sisson's house. She said she arrived there about seven minutes after the shooting and stayed until 10:30 or 11:00 P.M.

The two girls were lying on the floor and Dorothy helped put them in the car along with Willine McIntyre, and Cindy (Celeste Davis' sister) In the room were, Dorothy Conrod and her aunt and mother, Mrs. Anderson, and George MacIntyre. She said they wanted to clean up the blood, but decided to let it stay until the law came. Mayor Derrough and Milan came, and the Mayor asked what happened and began to make phone calls. After this the mayor wanted to take care of Mrs. Sisson's arms.

Dorothy Conrod says she saw a bullet laying on the window sill of the window without the fan, but did not say anything about it to anyone. She says she saw Milan pick it up a little later, at least she saw Milan go to the window sill, and the bullet wasn't there after he left.

She says they stood around and talked the remainder of the time.

Interview with Mr. ~~Bungsten~~ Lundox, on Center st., second house South East of E. Reden st.

He says he was watching T.V. when he heard a shot (thought it was a firecracker) then heard a car moving fast. He then got out to try and see the car but missed it. While trying to see the car he heard four or five shots from the direction of the Sisson's. "Told you it was firecrackers"

Interview with Mr. Edward Taylor: lives across from Mr. MacDonald.

Mr. Taylor was home in the kitchen eating supper, and had gone to the bathroom, when he heard shots. By the time he came up front he could only see the tail end of the car as it turned the corner and sped down Center st. (Headed North)

He said the car was moving fast for in a few minutes he heard more shots at Mr. Sisson's house.

He said Mr. Sally came down and asked if anyone got shot down here. Mr. Taylor said no, but also said he has not been ~~sent~~ necessary into Mr. MacDonald's house to see about what happened and what actual damage was inflicted.
