What is Mississippi Baptist Seminary? A state chartered school of religion to train Negroes in Christian leadership.

Who controls Mississippi Baptist Seminary? A Board of Trustees. Eleven
White trustees must be members of Mississippi Baptist Convention Board and
are elected by the Convention Board to a term of three years. Ten Negro trustees
are recommended to the Board of Trustees. The charter requires a majority of
one White trustee.

What is Mississippi Baptist Seminary? A system of teaching centers and extension classes of centers.

Who controls a center? A local Board of Trustees, elected by the White Baptist association or associations of a given area. The local Board of Trustees must have a majority of one White trustee. The number of trustees for a center is not fixed. Negro trustees are recommended to the Board of Trustees for election. They are recommended by their conventions or associations.

What is the responsibility of the Board of Trustees of a center? Fix a budget, elect a dean, supervise expenditures, elect a faculty, provide a place for classes and work with the dean in the total operation of the center. Every center must comply with the policy of Mississippi Baptist Seminary.
