I was at home the night of the meeting. I was worried when my husband didn't come home, the next maming I went down to Doretha Logan's house and she told me she had two or three kids that hadn't come home, and they were probably in jail.

I didn't do anything else, I turned to the news and I heard them broadcasting in the next morning, on WABG. They said they arrested 58 Negro marchers coming through the town of Itta Bena . When they said they arrested them and taken them in a bus and carried them to the Greenwood jail, I really thought he was in jail. I didn't do anything, there wasn't nothing I could do.

I just told my children their father was locked up in jail, they hated it and cried, some of them did.

Mr. Irving was a maintenanc~~ee~~ worker on M.V.C. campus. \$158.00

Since he has been in jail the only food we have had has been the food from the SNCC office, and some food my mother gave me.

The children haven't been getting any milk. They haven't been getting any meat, no more than a little pork meat that my mother gave to me.

Both she and her husband have been down to try and register.

I really think they just did them unfair. I just really hated for him to be locked up. The kids miss him very much.
