You may not know that on Saturday night 12:30, there was a near riot in the Six Point area. Two men began fighting and the police were called to them and others. There were sis to twelve officials cars.

one 17 year old boy, high school srudent was handcuffed, thrown against the paddy-wagón. Another bey from Monroe Vo-cational was cheked from behind by an officer. Two girls who were trying to get out of their way had their arms twisted behind them and were arrested. One lady was arrested on her front perc hand snatched from the door. One boy was shot in his hip and put in a paddy wafon. A large number of persons were arrested who stood by. It has also been reported that two persons have been beayon in Jail and are not being proportly fed.

LEE COUNTY: TEENS TACKLE SMITHVILLE

- - Mine students from the Loe County Training school began voter registration work in Smithville last week. They contacted fifty-one residents, asking these people to overcome their fears and register to vote.

Three of the group went to the court---house-in Loosburg and attempted to registor. But the registrar said he was "too busy collecting taxos", and gruffly turned them away. The teen-agers said that he wasn't doing any thing but roading a newspaper. They all expressed fear of the registrar, but pledged to return.

Toon-agors are the greatest asset we have in our Movement. While the secalled adults confusedly vacilate and hositate from taking action - toenagors just ACT.

Smithville is called "a bad town" in Lee County. Many of the older people in the Loe County Lovement just sadly shake their head when they think of the work that's needed there. They remember In spite of the more subtle attempts on the patelesce this summer when voter registration workers tried to canvass in the town. But the teenagers went there and started to work. They faced the angry white men who followed them throughout: the day with automobiles.

> The actions of those young people should be an inspiration to all of us. It's not enough to be inspired, though. We must support them. All the people in the counties look to Albany for support. We must give it to them. We should attend every mass meeting that we can, in Lee Terrell, and Sunter Counties . .
