JULIAN BOND, COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR



Horace Julian Bond has been Communications Director for SNCC since 1962.

He was a founding member of the Committee on Appeal for Human Rights, the Atlanta student anti-segregation group which led early desegregation efforts in that city in 1960 and 1961. He was present at the Raleigh conference at which SNCC was formed on Easter weekend, 1960.

Bond, 24, is the former managing editor of the <u>Atlanta Inquirer</u>, a Negro weekly newspaper. He attended Morehouse College in Atlanta for three years after graduation from the George School near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1957.

He has engaged in anti-segregation activity in Georgia, Alabama and Arkansas, and oversees the operations of SNCC' Communications Departmnt and production section.

His poetry has been anthologized in American Negro Poetry and Beyond the Blues.

He was born in Nashville in 1940 and has lived in Atlanta for the past seven years.
