AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this twenty-second day of July 1963, by and between certain representatives of the Neuro citizens of the City of Combridge, Maryland, certain representatives of the State of Maryland and City of Combridges

WITHESSTH

WHEREAS the Nagro citizens of the City of Cambridge have ergenized for the purpose of aliminsting racial aggregation and discrimination in all public institutions and privately-exceed business establishments cataring to the general public in the City of Cambridge; and have as their further purpose and objective the securing of equal employment apportunities and better housing facilities for all of the Negro citizens of Cambridge and:

WHEREAS the Negro citizens of Cambridge have petitioned city efficials of Cambridge toward the accomplishment of these ends and;

WHEREAS the resolution of these problems has accustomed racial unrest in the City of Cambridge for a period of appreximately minetoen months and;

WHEREAS the situation became such as required, on June 14, 1963, the ordering of the Maryland National Guard to Cambridge to maintain passes and order in that community and;

WHEREAS despite the presence of the National Guard, incidents have occurred which have approvated and heightened tensions brought on by the ottompted resolution of such realed problems and:

WHEREAS since the proclemation of the Governor sending the National Guard to the City of Cambridge, there have been numerous sectings between representatives of the Napro citizens, and representatives of the City of Cambridge and State of Maryland, at which time the various grisvenous aforesaid were discussed and proposals tendered by the Magno citizens were considered, all of which were predicated upon a desire of these representing the Nagro community to achieve equal rights and apportunities and;

WHEREAS further progress can best be obtained in an atmosphere of calm and seconly end;

WHEREAS various negotiations, including those held today, July 22, 1953, under the auspices of the United States Department of Justice, have produced material and tengible accomplishments to the satisfaction of the just and equitable you's of the Negro citizens of Cambridge, some of which are as follows:

- (i) The wayor and City Council of Cambridge have appointed a bi-racial committee, designated as the Human Relations Commission of the City of Cambridge, on which Commission four Plagra citizens have been named as members.
- (2) A Negro citizen has been retained, effective August 1, 1968, as an interviewer with the Department of Employment Security of the State of Neryland in the Combridge office.
- (3) The Mayor and Commissioners of Cambridge have adapted a charter amendment which provides for desegragation of places of public accommodation. Though said charter amendment may be subject to a referencium, as provided by law, it is the hope of all those signing this agreement that such a referencium vate will not be necessary and that said amendment will became effective an August 20, 1963. The parties hereto express the being that it is in the best interests of the entire city of Cambridge that the charter amendment not be petitioned to referencium.
- (4) Firm assurances were received today that desegragation of the first four grades in the Darchester County school system will be accomplished by the opening of the school year, September 1963, and that applications for admission to any grade in any

school within the Derchester County school system are now ready to be received and processed without regard to rece, aread or color.

(5) The wayor and Commissioners of the City of Cambridge, acting by and through its duty constituted Flowing Authority, will cause the necessary applications to be filed with the Fuderal Housing Administration in order to obtain a law rent public housing project which will materially benefit the Pragra community. Absolute confirmation of such action has been received today from the Nayor and Commissioners of Cambridge, and, at a meeting between Nagra representatives of the City of Cambridge, held in the City of Vashington, D. C. with Dr. Robert C. Veaver, Federal Heuring Administrator, Dr. Veaver gave assurances that such application would be expeditiously processed.

In recognition of the above, and in order to echieve continued cooperation in a climate most conductive to successful implementation of the purposes set forth in this agreement, the representatives of the Negro citizens of the City of Combridge increby egree that there will be no form of protests or descentrations for an incoming pariod hereafter.

The parties hereto whose signatures are affixed below realize that although there are no legal senctions offered to this agreement yet it is considered as imposing a moral obligation upon them to abide by and fully support the spirit and intention of this agreement.
