

MEMO TO: FRIENDS OF SNCC GROUPS, SOME CONTACTS

First of all, Sandra (Casey) Hayden has gone to Mississippi to work on a new literacy project being developed there. She wants any of you who want to keep up personal contact to write her c/o Tougaloo College, Tougaloo, Mississippi. They will know how to reach her. More on the project later Miss "Dinky" Romilly is our new Northern Coordinator, and Dinky will be handling all contacts with you.

We are sending out copies of the new Danville, Virginia pamphlet now. They should reach you shortly.

After series of debates, it has been decided that we would like to "sell" them for a voluntary contribution, as it states on the back sheet. Hopefully, they can be used as a fund raising piece too, and also pay for themselves. We are asking that they be sold, if possible, for 25¢, not because they are worth 25¢ but because we hope they will go over for fund-raising purposes.

They will be released to liberal publications, newspapers and liberal political groups within the next few days, with the intention of getting the widest possible distribution. We are asking them to advise their readers, subscribers and contacts of their availability. Orders will be directed to this office.

We have tried to focus on one community in the South where SNCC efforts and the efforts of the local people were met with violent repression. The pamphlet is an attempt to show some of the facts as opposed to the myths of one city where police brutality occurred.

It is worth noting that the incidents recorded took place in the so-called liberal upper South.
