I am writing those people and organizations whom I think really want to support the militant civil rights movement of the Mississippi Council Of Federated Organizations (COFO) and specifically the work in Washington County. The COFO program includes voter registration, payment of poll tax by the February 1st deadline, running candidates in the June 3rd Democratic Primary and November 4th election (Jamie Whitten and John Stennis are up then) and general civil rights work. The Aaron Henry Campaign For Governor is one recent example of COFO's work.

It may surprise you to know that over \$4,000 has been spent here since July 1st, with only 1/8th being contributed locally. We cannot continue to depend upon SNCC to finance us since they have to support work all over the country, including hard core areas much poorer than Greenville. We therefore are setting up a monthly pledge system to continue our work. The first item is a one time purchase of a mimeograph machine. With our heavy usage we need an excellent electric machine costing about \$470. The other items are expenses which need payment each month. Please take one or two items and send us that amount each month, or contribute toward our annual budget:
