Dear Sirs:

Spring Vacation is a time when college students from all over the nation head north to the sunny beaches of Florida. During the coming spring vacation, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference of St. Augustine, Florida, invites the Massachusetts Chapter of the SCLC and clergy and students from the colleges and universities of New England to join with it in its struggle for human rights in St. Augustine.

This call is issued because of the particularly deplorable conditions which the city of St. Augustine is now said to be. The oldest historic city in the United States is one in which the patterns of discrimination, hatred, and violence are most deeply entrenched. As this city prepares to celebrate its Quadricentennial, it asks the people of the nation for support through a congressional appropriation of \$500,000. It is proudly authorized to use a sign, as an example to the world, of a free people in a free country, when that sign daily denies freedom to its Negro citizens.

The Southern Christian Leadership Conference of St. Augustine hopes that clergymen and students from New England will act with it in bringing to light the tough conditions existing for Negro citizens of this city and help in making a remedy for this moral blight which lays so heavily on the nation as well as on this community.
