Dear Bob,


Enclosed are a dozen copies of the list that Casey Hayden forwarded to me from the Jackson office. Casey worked on the literacy project there for most of the last year, and should know what she is talking about in the area of programmed materials. If you want more copies of the list just call.

I would assume that we would ask for 25-50 (preferably 50) copies of the book from each publisher. That way we would use one book for one school, another for the next school, etc., and be able to have a good textbook coverage.

In addition to these books, there is one specific book which has been requested as an absolute must: The Pictorial History of the Negro, edited by Langston Hughes, and published by Crown Publishers. Staughton Lynd, a Spelman College faculty member working on the curriculum coordination, has written them requesting 25 copies (one for each school) but that strikes me as a bare minimum. Perhaps we could get more?

There is another list of ten basic books on the way which I don't yet have and will forward to you when it comes in.
