B Negroes wentto procinct meeting at the Old Voterans Roke; the foor was locked; Gus I ble and John Chance (Noble is WCC Exec.) went to the door and were admitted. Two men from the governors staff arrived (Norman Jones and Bob Yandel) and were admitted. Negroes continued to try to enter and were finally told the meeting was over.

They went to the Courthouse, where another precinct meeting was to have been held, and were ordered out by the sheriff. At the courthouse a law student who was present gave a Mr. Word an affadavit to fill out and was arrested for distributing litterature leaflets. He was threatened while in jail.

Mrs. Robinson, one of the paople elected as a delegate at this meeting, went to Jackson. When she returned, she was visited at her home by a white man who claimed to be assistant to the registrar. He asked her questions about how long she'd lived in her home and whether the she had relatives in the city.

Library Precinct: 3 whites, 7 Negroos. 6 Negroos not allowed to participate on the grounds that they had not paid their poll taxes all were questioned on whether they were registered; election was not by secret ballot

Meetings also attended in Walthall, Easen, Central, and Dixie Pines preclusts but no word on results there

Northeids Precient: 3 Negroes; there was no voting, all minimum nomination accompted with by acclemation; 6 cops and groups of 30 white kids looked on. Negroes afracty to introduce resolution Southeids Precinct: 1 Negro arrived; was teld meeting was over
