the BLACK REVOLUTIONS RELATIONSHIP to the BANDUNG WORLD

As recent events have shown, the Afro-American can no longer waste time supporting "responsible leaders" respectability, but must analize the direction and tempo of his struggle and organize for survival, or die. We see that with the increase of bombings, shootings, murders, beatings and the type of riots where only Black people get hurt, the Afro-American must develop a vanguard that is capable of leading the Black Revolution to Victory. History shows us that the only people capable of this task are Black Youth. With the racial situation intensifying and polarizing we see a civil war developing in the racist U.S.A.

We also see that the racist U.S.A. while it talks of "Democracy" and the so-called "Free" world, is the most racist-imperialist low down, under handed power in the world. We see that while the racist U.S. is exporting propaganda through "Radio Free Europe", Afro-Americans in order to hear the truth must listen to "Radio Free Dixie": We see that while the racist U.S.A. talks about "peace" it wages war against the great people of South VietNam, the National Liberation Front of South Viet Nam and has the audacity to send racist white and confused black troops into Africa to support Uncle Tom leaders and fight against the courageous Congolese National Liberation Front. We see that the same racist beast that rapes Afro-Americans are raping Asia, Africa, and Latin America. We have come to the conclusion that "Charlies" enemies are our friends" and "oppose everything he (Charlie) supports and support everything he opposes". With these conditions in the racist U.S.A. and in the world we call on Black Youth to Unite or Perish

The purpose of this conference is:

- 1. To consolidate and further implement the 13 points of the May 1, 1964 Nashville Conference. The 13 points are:
 - 1. Development of a permanent underground secretariat to carry out plans.
 - 2. To push the Bourgeois reformist as far "up tempo" as fast as possible, while at the same time laying a base for an underground movement.
 - 3. The Conference united with the African, Asian and Latin American Revolution (Attempt to get financial help from friendly forces).
 - 4. Adopt Robert F. Williams as leader in exile.
 - 5. The achievement of Afro-American solidarity (to push the Restoration of the Revolutionary Spirit to Pan Africanism).
 - 6. Conference philosophy Pan African Socialism.
 - 7. The setablishment of Internal Bulletin for Conference.
 - 8. Construction of a Pan African Student Conference.
 - 9. Secretariat contact all student Liberation Organizations around the world to develop rapport and coordination.
 - 10. National Public organ, name: Black America.
 - 11. Charge genocide against U.S. Imperialism before the United Nations.
 - 12. Secretariat develop program for Revolutionary Black Nationalists.
 - 13. Develop two Revolutionary Centers.
- 2. To present a creative program in which Afro-American Youth will be the vanguard in the Black Revolution.
- 3. To consolidate the relationship of Afro-American Youth and youth of Africa, Asia and Latin America to make it more effective in the anti-imperialist struggle.
- 4. To mobilize the national organization of Afro-American Youth into action against the oppressor.
- 5. To support and implement the program of R.A.M. Revolutionary Action Movement.

We are therefore urging you to come to Nashville, Friday, Saturday and Sunday Oct. 30 - Nov. 1, 1964, for a National Afro-American Student Conference on Afro-American Youth. The aim of this conference is to initiate a program of survival and Revolutionary action for Afro-American Youth.

We ask you to let us know by sending the attached application blank whether we can expect you and/or others from your area. We also urge you to communicate with and write other persons of African descent with whom you are in contact, whether in your area or elsewhere.

Briefly for your information (A.S.M.) is an Afro-American Student group which is located within several campuses.

*Radio Free Dixie - is the radio broadcast of Robert F. Williams exiled leader of R.A.M. - Revolutionary Action Movement. Brother Williams was chased out of the country of Racist U.S.A. by the Federal Government and its "lackeys" on a trumped up "Frame Up" of kidnapping in August of 1961. Brother Williams went to Cuba to live in temporary exile as leader of the Afro-American Revolution. Since that time the racist federal U.S. government and its' spies have done everything in their power to block the broadcasting of Radio Free Dixie and the publishing and distribution of the "Crusader", Brother Williams monthly newsletter.
