You have probably read in the newspapers of the MFDP Congressional Challenge to the regular Mississippi representatives who claim their seats by virtue of these elections. ACLU is supporting this fact-findix documenting effort in Mississippi and is asking attorneys to go to Mississippi now, beginning on January 20, 1965, to take the evidence to present to the House Committee on Elections.
