SUMMARY OF RECRUITING DEPARTMENT REPORT

1. We have four road teams, the West Coast, North West Central team, ~~East~~ East Coast team and the Ohio area team.
2. We have urban teams in Chicago, Detroit, Los Angeles, San Francisco, New York City, Washington, D.C., Boston, Minnesota, and Chicago.
3. We have received 206 applications from individuals at the Atlanta Office and from two schools. We have knowledge of 40 SCOPE chapters with a total of 800 applications. We have 35 SCOPE chapters in the process of forming with a possible membership of 600. There are 25 colleges that will either form SCOPE chapters or recruit individual volunteers with a possible membership of 250. We have 200 applications from the BAY Area of California SNCC chapters.

This gives us 1,850 applications, 250 possibilities and 75 SCOPE chapters. No applications have been approved at this time.

Functions of the Student Recruitment Department

A. Organization and equipping of recruitment teams

1. Assemble sufficiently-trained personnel to tour America's academic communities.
2. Do research and groundwork to prepare an itinerary for team.
3. Coordinate speakers and supplies to meet the needs of colleges in the area of the team.

B. At the present time three road teams and eight urban teams are out on the road and an itinerary and personnel have been selected for a fourth road team to tour the northwestern states.
