Dear Fearless CORE Worker:

Enclosed you will find many many things. Please take the time to go over the stuff and familiarize yourself with everything. It will save a lot of confusion and frustration in the future if you do it NOW.

1. If you have not already received your CORE identification cards, they are enclosed. I do not know what they are for.

2. We are sending you field fellowship applications and a brief letter of explanation. RECRUIT!

3. If the car on your project is a volunteer car, you will find enclosed two (2) copies of a volunteer car contract. The car owner should immediately fill them out, sign them and return one to Ronnie Moore in the State Office. The other copy is for the owner's personal records.

There are also driver permission forms enclosed. If you have a volunteer car and the owner wishes to authorize someone else to drive it, he should fill out this form. If you have a project car, the form has been filled out and should be kept in the glove compartment of the car to avoid arrest for car theft. (It has happened.)

4. There is a memo from Ronnie enclosed re: Finances & Reports. The reports requested in the memo (or outlines for same) are also enclosed. Please send your reports in on a regular schedule; there's a girl in the State Office who's a real bitch about missing reports.

5. We're sending a memo about complaints against the F.B.I. and the telephone company and one about the MCHR. These are very important.

6. There is a list of workers and their addresses and phone numbers by parish. Check your parish to see if the information is correct. If there are any mistakes, notify the State Office during your next WATS call. Don't assume that anything on the list is a typing error.

We hope you're really talking up the Community Conference. It's scheduled for Saturday, June 10, in Alexandria or Pineville. Only one staff person from each project may attend. A Louisiana staff meeting will be held in mid-July.

I know there's a lot here, but it is important. Please go over it carefully.
