Dear Friend:

SNCC forces in the state of Alabama have been maneuvering in preparation for programs of political organization throughout the Black Belt counties of Central Alabama.

The year long program (January-December, 1966) will concentrate in 16 to 22 counties in Alabama organizing people on a county to county basis in an independent political movement. Freedom schools and adult classes will be conducted providing for political education for Negroes newly registered under the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

The importance of recruitment is clear. Local people need help before they can initiate and direct citizenship education, voter registration, and other community development programs.

In answer to this need SNCC is asking for volunteers who 1. have had some experience or training in practical politics or who are willing to learn 2. who have practical training in running voter registration programs and establishing community support for such programs 3. who can provide for themselves financially for at least four months of the intended year's program.

It is essential that volunteers commit themselves for the entire year's program if this program is to be successful. There will be a session to orient workers for the Alabama project in late January or early February in Atlanta, Georgia.
