

REPORT

At the beginning of this week we decided that the best way to accomplish SCOPES 3 functions in this county was to set up small community organizations in each community of Negroes in the county. Theoretically there would be one community organization within walking distance of every Negro in the community. The function of these groups would be to encourage registration to provide a means for political education, and to provide the beginnings of an effective organization to use the votes that the Negro community will have.
