POLL WATCHER TRAINING

• Pollwatchers:

The following is a list of the specific actions of the inspectors and clerks which the pollwatchers should "keep an eye on.": 1. Make sure that all persons individually sign the poll lists as they enter the polling place. If they can write, don't let anyone-else sign their name. (175) If the voters cannot write, an election official will write the name of the voter on the poll list and the voter will make his mark, an X or similar symbol by his name. The poll watcher should make sure the election official signs the name of the voter and no other name. In case there is graft in the election and on inspection has to be made afterwards, the signature is the only proof that this person voted. Otherwise, a crooked election official could sign no name or someone else's name and later claim this person didn't vote in the election.

- 2. Each bollot will have a two inch square at the bottom.

 Made sure the number in the square is the same as the number on the poll list which the voter signs or has signed for him when he enters the polling place. The "poll list" is the list of people voting. This is to prevent persons from adding ballots of persons who didn't vote or throwing away the ballots of people that did vote.
- 3. Make sure there is no recess in the course of the election. (133) Do not allow the election officials to close the polls between *:(C a.m. and 5:(C or 6:(C p.m., depending upon when the polls officially close (172) If it did close, election officials could tamper with the ballots.
- 4. In order that everyone will have a secret ballot, make sure the black seal is placed over the number on the bottom of the ballot. (180) The black seal has glue around the edges but nothing in the center.
- 5. Make sure that people who can't read and write are provided the assistance of any person they select. The person they choose can enter the voting booth with the voter that can't read, but can remain in there only five minutes. (176). They should then leave the polling place with the voters. The person they choose to assist them can be a friend, relative, minister or anyone else except a candidate in the election. (177)

* Pollyatcheis:

- along with the poll lists and votes must be sealed up in a wood or tin box fastened with locks, and then given to the returning officer who is to give the box to the sheriff of the county. The votes are to be rolled up and labeled to show how many voters each candidate received. The rejected ballots are also ballots are also to be rolled up and placed in the box. (195) These must be presented by the returning officer to the sheriff within forty-eight hours after the election. (197) The sheriff keeps the sealed boxes for six months and then takes the packages out of the box and without breaking the seals, destroys them unless such box is legally demanded by grand jury befor the six months has expired. The results of the election must be recorded on the certificate of the election and signed by all the inspectors and clerks. The poll lists must also be signed including the day and year the election was held and for what offices.
