Rev. Clifton Whitley, 32, is the Methodist Chaplain and Dean of Students at Rust College in Holly Springs. He is married and has two children. Rev. Whitley studied at Rust College; at Schools of Theology in Atlanta and Denver. He served in Korea with the 7th Infantry Div.

Active in Civil Rights since 1958, he has served as area officer for S.N.C.C., as executive secretary in N.A.A.C.P., and as an assistant precinct captain with M.F.D.F.

king for house

Rev. Edwin King, a Methodist minister, is the Chaplain of Tougaloo College and Pastor of the Tougaloo United Church of Christ. Mr. King and his wife, Jeannette, are both native Mississippians. They have one daughter.

Mr. King was born and attended school in Vicksburg. He graduated from Millsaps College and has since studied at Boston and Harvard Universities. Since 1960 he has been arrested over a dozen times in Miss. and Ala. for civil rights - he has been beaten in jails and on the steps of white churches.

In 1963 he worked closely with his friend, Medgar Evers in the Jackson Movement. On the Freedom vote he ran for Lt. Gov. with Dr. A. C. Henry for Gov. Mr. King is National Committeeman for the SDF.
