

BOYCOTT SPURS TOWN TO BUILD SEWERAGE LINES IN EDWARDS

The Edwards Board of Aldermen signed a contract with a company in Jackson last Dec to contruct sewerage lines and a treatment lagoon. This will cost \$375,000.

Although the town has said it would build sewerage lines, there is no question but that pressure from the boycott helped speed up the plans.

To pay for this the town applied for and received a \$42,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Welfare.

The town also issued a revenue bond for needed -- \$333,000.

WHY DIDN'T NEGROES IN EDWARDS KNOW ABOUT THIS?

Part of the reason is our own fault. We don't ask the right questions somethimes because we're afraid.

But also we don't know the law which says that all official public notices must be published in the Edwards Hummer. Very few Negroes read that paper. The law also says the town can post public notices in three places in town for at least ten days.

Most Negro taxpayers were amazed at the taxes they had to pay this year. Almost all Negroes had their taxes raised. Many had their taxes raised by 100 per cent. Only a few Whites had their taxes raised that much.

The White folks worked it like this: they raised the rate of taxation from 13 to 15 mills. That means if your house was valued at \$1000 you paid \$13 at the 13 mill rate and \$15 at the 15 mill rate.

> Every town law (which is called Ordinance) is listed in the minutes.

Every bit of tax information you want to know is listed in the tax assessor's book. Mrs. Harrell as you know is in charge of all tax m business for the town.

You can report twon officials who fail People should attend town board meetings to show you official public records. Rememberyou are a part of the public. Negroes must ask for their rights under law or else they won't receive them.

- July 7 Last day to register with circuit clerk to be able to vote in the November 7 general election.
- July 8 Last day to register with <u>circuit clerk</u> to be able to vote in the <u>August 8 primary election</u>.
- August 8 Primary election to choose party canidates for November 7.
- August 29 Second primary, if necessary, for the November 7 election.
- September 23 Last day to register with federal registrar to vote November 7.
