Background and Purpose

The July 20-23 National Conference on Black Power grows out of the 1966 Labor Day week-end planning session held in Washington, D. C., at the call of Representative Adam Clayton Powell.

The committee appointed at that time to continue plans for the Conference has organized a National Planning Committee composed of representatives of those at the first planning session and more than 100 others. The Planning Committee has underwritten promotion and publicity costs and is seeking to obtain funds for partial travel subsidies for young people from the South, the Middle West and Far West.

The Conference presently is designed to be limited to 400 delegates, all by pre-registration. The Conference seeks to be inclusive of all segments of the Black Community, and may have one-half of its delegates from the age group 18-28.

Black Power is here to stay. Those who participate in the Conference will help, as Black People, to give shape to Black Power as a positive and creative force in the life of the nation and the world.

The July 20-23 National Conference on Black Power seeks to achieve the following purposes:

1) To bring together representative Black Americans who believe in the necessity of encouraging black pride and solidarity and in the paramount need to empower Black People for fulfillment of the greatest good for all.

2) To deepen the common interests and alliances between old and young Black Americans.

3) To explore broadly the implications of Black Power relating to such issues as

- nationalism and world peace
- the life of our cities
- local, national and international politics
- efforts toward the elimination of poverty
- the economic, civic, social, educational and religious development and empowerment of Black People
- the special problems of young people.

4) In the light of the analysis of issues in terms of their power-producing possibilities, to propose practical programs to facilitate Black Power as a positive and creative force for the good of all.
