One reason they need help because before the "march, 1966" a few had bought homes and were working for local whites. Most of them lost their jobs because they sent their children to white schools, and because they took part in the marches and in voter registration. As you know Grenada has the highest per capital income ~~that~~ ^{of} any Delta County- that is it was like that before the march.
