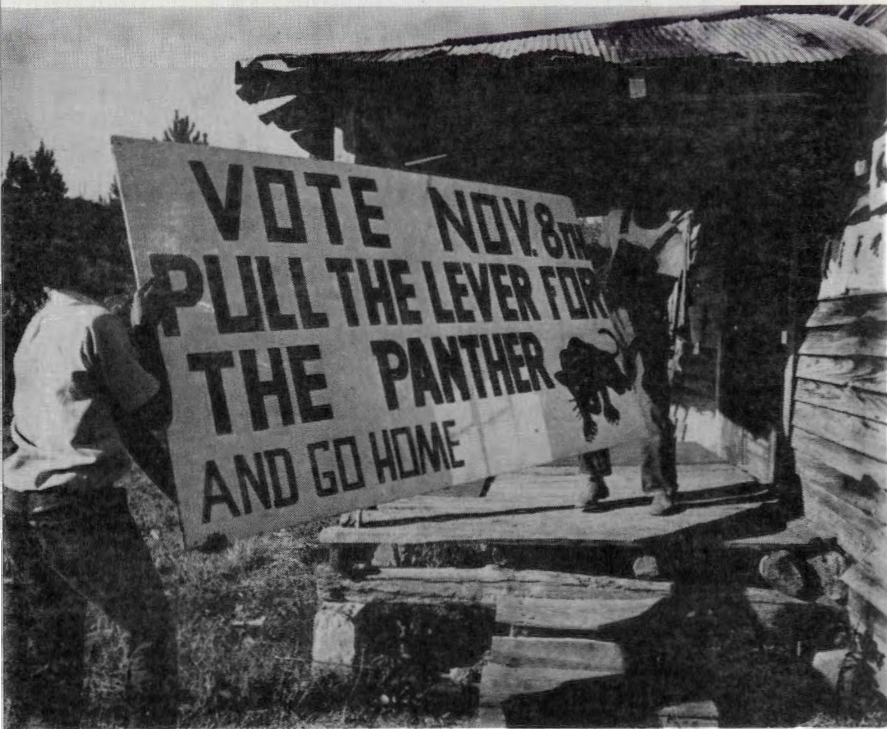

# Will you stand up for Your Liberation ?



CAN YOU MEET THE DEMANDS OF A RAPIDLY CHANGING SOCIETY OR ARE YOU INVOLVED IN THE EDUCATIONAL PROCESS ONLY TO EARN A LIVING?

The crucial question of color, poverty, and power are being raised explosively throughout this country. Black people are coming to recognize that racism and discrimination can not be intellectual exercises on morality but are, in fact, real, tangible, and oppressive barriers to our ability to exist as human beings.

Black people in the slums and ghettos of urban areas and the poverty stricken rural areas are in need of the best, sharpest, most perceptive young minds to aid in our struggle.

During this coming summer SNCC will sponsor an extensive and exciting summer project using students in the fight to attain self determination for black people in six crucial areas, namely: 1) politics 2) economics 3) education 4) housing 5) culture and 6) youth orientation. The projects will be located in several counties in Mississippi and Alabama and in several urban areas in the north and west.



The specifics of the work will range from activist civil disobedience and voter registration to cultural education and political and social research and analysis. Highly qualified full staff technicians in each of the seven areas will be assigned to every project where they will function administratively and will train students to operate efficiently on any level. Because of the seriousness of purpose, only those students who, in our estimation, can function most effectively under pressure will be selected.

The destiny of black people in this country lies heavily in the hands of our youths who must join hands with our black brothers and sisters and push toward liberation by any means necessary.

For, if our educated black youths do not begin to grapple for understanding they will be the least informed when the very foundation of this country rots from beneath their feet. We must move now to provide our brothers and sisters with those skills essential to our struggle for liberation through power. In the words of Dr. W. E. B. DuBois:

POWER CONCEEDS NOTHING WITHOUT A DEMAND; IT NEVER DID AND IT NEVER WILL

COME ON HOME WITH US THIS SUMMER.
