

WHAT MUST BE DONE:

On February 26, 1968, SNCC will file an appeal to the Supreme Court to overturn the travel restrictions on H. Rap Brown. Therefore, by February 19, 1968, as many people as possible should:

- 1) Send a telegram immediately to SNCC, 100 Fifth Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10011 requesting H. Rap Brown to speak on your campus. The United States Government is trying to say that people in the United States are not interested in the words of Chairman Brown.
- 2) Write letters of protest to Chairman H. Rap Brown protesting his illegal "house arrest." Your letter may be used as an affidavit which SNCC will attach to his appeal to the Supreme Court to overturn the racist decision of the Virginia judge.
- 3) Circulate and get signatures for the Citizens Amicus Brief in Support of H. Rap Brown's Appeal from his Bail Restrictions. A copy of the petition is enclosed.

If the movement is to survive and grow, we must understand that in the face of increasing repression it is our responsibility to clearly show the government that AN INJURY TO ONE IS AN INJURY TO ALL.

Please write in to the National Office as soon as possible to let us know what your chapter is doing to support SNCC in this case, and to show the government that SDS refuses to allow their attempt to isolate SNCC from the rest of the movement.

Has explaining and circulating this petition helped as an organizing tool on the issues of racism and repression? Please tell us any other ideas you may have for programs around these issues. We must pull ourselves together NOW!
