This matter was referred to SAC from national level. It was Elmer's request to start on June 7. The leader in Washington is J. H. Holloman. Holloman started using speakers throughout the state according to his plan to give it trying to get enough people to meet.

In Newark, June 8, several groups began arrived by bus to Newark. In Newark, June 8, they started gathering at a high school in Newark just off Highway 10. At 11:30 P. M. they left the school with the number of 10 to the north. They had a Carl Caraco rented truck with the trailer and three other vehicles and buses of speakers at the time. When they went out of the city limits the truck had stopped to W. J. Van Meter at about 24 was under 21 years of age. The vehicles are supposed to go to Governor Wallace and ask for more vehicles and then go to Washington.

The FBI, state investigators from Newark found, was intelligence, they will not proceed the matter, since the speakers with the city limits of Newark they were not escorted by any law enforcement personnel.

Some reporters were not there to give them any publicity and he was paid them any attention.

In my opinion the matter was a failure. There were only eight local Negroes in the Newark.
