(1) EASTER SATURDAY MARCH FOR PEACE, FREEDOM AND JOBS: THE UNFINISHED BUSINESS OF DEMOCRACY. The march will assemble at Figueroa and Santa Barbara at 12:30 PM. It will move south on Figueroa to Vernon, east on Vernon to Avalon, and south on Avalon to SOUTH PARK, where a mass rally will be addressed by Dr Linus Pauling, Paul Schrade of the UAW, L.A. CORE Chairman Arthur Silvers, and others. REMEMBER: YOUR PRESENCE IN THIS DEMOMSTRATION IS IMPORTANT.

(2) After the march and rally, there will be a beer-bust, beginning at 8 PM, at 914 North Doheny. Admission: \$1.00. All proceeds to CORE -- and we need it badly. Be sure to come.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING OF 12th MARCH. Val Coleman, who is in Los Angeles from National CORE, was introduced and spoke about the importance on a national scale of defeating the realtors' initiative against fair housing.

The membership voted to endorse the petition of the Youth Action League for Civil Rights to change the name of Alabama Street in Los Angeles to Evers Avenue, as has already been done in Compton.

The membership voted to join the Ad Hoc Committee to End Discrimination with the stipulation that L.A. CORE have a seat on the steering committee, and that there be a rule of unanimity on the steering committee governing direct action. The Ad Hoc Committee is currently negotiating with representatives of the Los Angeles hotel business. L.A. CORE's Executive Committee is to be polled before the initiation of any direct action.

Plans for a voter registration campaign were announced. FIELD WORKERS ARE NEEDED FOR THIS CAMPAIGN ON TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY EVENINGS FROM 5;30, AND ON SATURDAY AND SUNDAY FROM 10:00 AM. IF YOU CAN PARTICIPATE IN THIS VERY IMPORTANT PROJECT, CALL THE CORE OFFICE FOR FURTHER IN-FORMATION. THIS IS PERHAPS NOT A DRAMATIC ACTION. THERE IS ALMOST NO CHANCE OF ANYBODY'S GOING TO JAIL FOR PARTICIPATING IN IT. NEVERTHELESS IT IS A VITALLY NECESSARY PROJECT, AND YOUR PARTICIPATION IN IT IS URGENTLY NEEDED.

The Executive Committee was empowered to set a date for an action against Morris P. Kirk & Sons, a foundry where racial discrimination in upgrading exists. The motion stipulated that prior to the start of direct action there be personal contact by CORE with the union, and that the commitment of the local be sought on the union floor, but that CORE's action not be delayed by a failure of the union to respond to our request.

The membership voted to support any nonviolent direct action on the part of the committee which has been formed to combat racial discrimination in Montebello schools.

Owing largely to the work of Walt and Jane Walker and Paul Jackson, there has lately been a considerable increase in the participation of the clergy in the civil rights movement, especially in the Negro community, it was announced.
