April 25, 1964

Here on the steps of the State Capitol of Wisconsin, I affirm my complete personal commitment to the cause of human dignity, and to the struggle to end segregation in all its insidious forms.

To achieve these aims, I will not rest until all stand as free men.

I pledge my will and my vote to the enactment of state and national legislation which provides all citizens equal justice under the law in the fields of public accommodations, education, employment, and housing.

I deplore violence. Yet I equally condemn peaceful injustice. I therefore pledge my willingness to use non-violent protest, peaceful assembly, petition of my elected officials and every legal, democratic means at my disposal to carry out the fight for FREEDOM NOW!

I call upon all Americans to join me in pledging our hearts, minds, and bodies unequivocally to the achievement of social peace and opportunity through social justice.
