Civil Fights activity in Mississippi did not coase with the end of the Mississippi Summer Project of 1964. The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, working in cooperation with COFO (Council of Fedorated Organizations), is continuing and expanding its work in Mississippi and throughout the South. The moral, material, and financial support for the work during the summer that made it possible for the staff and summer volunteers to function must not stop now. The nation must continue to focus on Mississippi.

Bocause of the tremendous nood for this continued support, the New York office of SNCC has been working with students at various New York colleges in an attempt to dovelop educational, political pressuro, and fund-raising programs. Many students have expressed a desire to most with representitives from other schools and discuss projects that they have run, problems that they have encountered, and coordination of activities on the various college campuses for selected programs.

There will be a meeting at the New York SNCC office, 100 Fifth Avo. at 15 St., Room 803, on December 18 at 7:00 P.M. for these purposes. It is important that representitives of all schools that receive this mailing (schools where there is now SNGC oriented activity) attend, so that the broadest and most inclusive program can be doveloped. We hope that there will be two or three representitives from each group present, so that we can have a full discussion.
