FACT: Within the past several months, the Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King and other civil rights and community leaders have launched an offensive against slum housing in Chicago's Negro ghetto areas. Dr. King and his associates have taken up residence in slum properties on Chicago's West side, in order to dramatize slum housing conditions and bring public pressure to bear on slum landlords.

PRINCIPLE: "USNSA reaffirms its commitment to the right of every citizen to equal opportunity in all aspects of his daily life regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sex, national origin or economic condition... The concepts of citizen and community organization for the elimination of social evils are a basic democratic principles."
(Codification of Policy, 1965-1966, p. 75, The Student and the City, R. XV999)

DECLARATION: The Illinois-Wisconsin Region supports the efforts of Dr. King and his colleagues in conjunction with local civil rights leaders to end slum housing conditions.

MANDATE: The region mandates the chairman to communicate the text of the above resolution to Dr. King, officials of the SCLC, CCCO, and relevant city officials.
