

Two objectives were set for the region for the fall action. First, to pull together the chapters and fraternal organizations in the area and to co-ordinate these energies to build a strong all-Bay area organization. Secondly, to organize a strong, militant action for the fall focused on the IIC. Slowly but steadily these objectives are being met. Work has proceeded on all fronts; making contacts, getting out literature, showing films, speaking to groups, and leafleting. Regional council meetings have kept most people informed of how and where work is proceeding. This newsletter will not recapitulate those meetings but will firm up plans for the IIC.

The long range perspective on making contacts and building a strong organization is going on past the IIC. A lot of long range work has been going on the past several weeks-in the last few days before the IIC it is essential to get maximum saturation of areas where the most people can be mobilized for the opening day on Monday. Using this as an organizing tool and to consolidate contacts local chapters are urged to hold mass meetings after the Monday demonstration to explain the days happenings, lay out plans for the day and for education around the political demands. If leaflets and posters are put out announcing a meeting on the campus or in the community new people can be drawn in to build for the next day and to make new contacts. Immediately we need everyone out leafleting intensely the few days and weekend before Monday. Local chapters are coordinating this-if you have been out of contact with them they could use help. Those not in contact with local chapters could call the office if they have time to help.

Many questions have come up about which days to mobilize for and which actions to emphasise. MONDAY is the day-the opening day of the IIC must be met with massive action to STOP the IIC. Our models for this are Chicago and Rocky's trip to South America. Monitors will be organized and tactical instructions will be given at the rally on Monday. People are urged to move in small groups staying close together, taking care of each other and taking care of business. In addition to Monday-Thursday banquet where Nixon may appear is the focus for the working class mobilization. But the whole week will depend on Monday!

The regional office still has literature on hand. Fifty thousand and more of the mass leaflets are ready; stickers, buttons and posters are available. Anyone who has time to spare can drop by to sticker up the city and put posters in windows.
