NEW YORK-- Mr. A. Philip Randolph and Mr. Jackie Robinson today issued the following statement:

"The attack on The Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.,

beloved leader of the integration struggle has added a new dimension of importance to the Youth March for Integrated Schools in Washington.

"Dr. King, Jr. was closely identified with the conception and planning of the March and intended to be in the line of march.

"As a constructive expression of sympathy for him, many groups are planning to enlarge their participation in the March. To give opportunity for the fullest participation of all and increase its effectiveness, the March committee announces the postponement of the date to SATURDAY, OCTOBER 25. We urge the continued support of all so that the demonstration will have maximum success."
