Later in the evening, two Negro cars pursued the vehicle they believed had been involved in the shooting from Magnolia Street to a Texaco Station on E.J. Wiqqins Caw a shotgun himed toward him by the whites, turned back toward his car, and discovered the police were ready to haul it away. He was put in a state highway patrol car, driven to the Pascagoula jail, and charged with attempted assault and using profane language.

Two passengers in the second pursuit car, Lemar Turnipseed and E.J. Hudson, were held at the same jail on concealed weapons charges. Police made no effort to search the white car, contending it was not involved in the shooting.

The Knightsof Pykthias Hall was firebombed June 23. Dange was slight. ###
