VOTING BILL

The proposed voting bill recently left the House Judiciary sub-committee #5. The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee as well as the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, and the Congress of Racial Equality has jointly stated that this piece of legislation is inadequate and needs basic changes.

SNCC urges everyone to write to Congressman Lionel VanDeerlin and demand that he support the following:

1. That new and free elections be held no sooner than 6 and no later than 9 months after the bill takes effect in those states which the bill covers.
 2. A bill to make murder in civil rights cases a major Federal crime.
 3. The immediate unseating of the Mississippi Congressional delegation.
 4. An executive order to the FBI to make on-the-spot arrests when Federal laws are violated. (USC, Title 18, sections 241 and 242.)
