Atlanta, Georgia, April 4, 1966 -- Rep-Elect Julian Bond, re-elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in February, has been challenged again.

In a hearing today at the state capitol the House set May 23 to hear charges that Bond should be denied his seat a second time. Bond and his attorney, Howard Moore, Jr., have until May 13 to file a response. They may subpoena witnesses for the Hearing on the 23rd.

The young Negro representative tallied an 82% victory in the 136th District when he ran in September. Bond was denied his seat in the House in January because he supported a statement of opposition to United States involvement in the War in Vietnam issued by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee.

Bond ran unopposed in a Special Election in February, to fill the vacancy created by his ouster from the House.
