JACKSON:

re accident- to Joanne Bowman: Gene's condition seems fairly good. His parents have come down and are covering financial expenses. Mike is still in the recovery room but we think he's coming along.

to Mike Sayer:

There is a trial in Greenwood today --68 people are on trial, many of them people working on the Henry campaign. Mike doesn't know what the case is, but wants Julian and Mary to check into it and get a release out. If these people have to go to jail it will seriously impair the Henry campaign.

re the arrests at Jackson churches yesterday: one of the 12 arrested was a white member of the church - he was arrested inside the church and the church disclaims all responsibility for the arrest. The understanding is that the police case in on their own.

SELMA: 10 am to Willie Robinson

75 Negroes were at the courthouse and had gotten there at about 7:30am. The first 10 numbers were held by Negroes who had received them on Friday. The rest of the 60 were held by whites. The Negroes in line will remain however, and will write letters into the judge. More are expected later in the day.

There was a mass meeting on Sunday evening- Rev. Minette, a local minister, spoke. About 500 attended. Things seem to be going well.
