3 arrested yesterday, they had served part of their term because they had served time before the court session and it applied to the sentence. They had one day left to go. Two were released today, Larry Wilson, 18, chairman of local CORE chapter, and Sally ~~W~~ Hiatt, 22 - both from Danville. Annie Mae Farmer remains in jail for 9 more days. These were arrests going back to summer lie-in. Farmer's arrest was at High Street church, charge "abusive language and resisting arrest."

All of the arrestees today refused to give their names - said their names were "Freedom Now" and "Black and White Together"
