When James Jones took the motions from Attorney George Howard to John Bradford and Bruce Jordan's trial (Atty. Howard couldn't be there) he was confronted by Police Chief Roy Ross.

Ross said:

"Are you guys gonna bond these fellows out or leave them with us. Well kiddo, I'm gonna tell you. Whenever you come here across that Philips County line we've got you. Take that station wagon, that literature and all that Snick stuff and get out of here if you know what's good for you. Be sure and tell your buddy Hansen that everything I've told you goes for him."

There were several FBI agents at the trial. Bill had called them last night and told them he was afraid their civil rights would be violated as they had been twice before - when Bill, John and Bruce were first arrested and when John and Bruce were arrested last week. He didn't think they had heard what Ross told Jones though.

Bradford and Jordan got 30 days, \$500 fine (costs) and \$1,500 bond, for "threatening to make a disturbance."
