Incidents: Saturday, March 28 Henry Glenn, Jr. of Sunflower Cty. was four miles east of Ruleville was driving on Rts. 8 a few miles outside of Ruleville and came upon a car which was blocking the road near the Quiver River and he got out the four white men if they needed any help and they told him he was trying to be a "smart nigger" and then they just grabbed him and threw him over the bridge. he was able to swim and escape. the feeling on the part of people in Ruleville (Hamer, etc.) is that they meant to get someone else. relevance to campaign is that it seemed they meant to get someone else, otherwise not "directly" involved.

Petty Carter who lives on the Coleman plantation in Northern Leflore, ~~xxxx~~ mother of nine children, who attempted to register in Greenwood on March 4 was told yesterday by the plantation owner that ~~sh~~ he wasn't going to have that mess on his plantation. and told her that she would have to give him 115 dollars and move. Mrs. Carter is a day worker who during the off season is supported by her 13 year old son who works for 30 cents an hour for ten hours a day seven days a week cleaning bricks and feeds cows. Mrs. Carter has been refused welfare by the administration of the ~~xxxx~~ state welfare program. and only those
